WHAT DO YOU WEAR IN CHURCH?

Have you ever thought of what you wear in church? I'm **not** talking of what we wear to our assembly on Sunday. I'm talking of the **church** we're a part of every day of our life - the spiritual church we've been added to. What are we wearing in *that* church? Our spiritual bodies need **spiritual** garments.

It's something we **better** be thinking about. The church in Laodicea thought they were doing well, but the Lord told them they were "wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind and NAKED" (Rev 3:17). They didn't have ANY clothes. They were NAKED. The Lord told them to buy from HIM the clothes they needed. He mentioned one spiritual garment we wear in 1 Peter 5:5 - "and be clothed with HUMILITY". Jesus was humble, we should be also.

The Lord told us of the importance of our garments in the parable of the wedding feast in Matthew 22:11-14. How there was a guest that didn't have on a garment suitable for a WEDDING and how he was CAST OUT because of it. Sit up and talk notice folks, this was a parable of the KINGDOM of HEAVEN!

We also are going to a wedding, it's ours, to our Lord. Will He be happy to see us? We can't wear dirty coveralls or go naked to this wedding. We must be clothed in humility, love, faithfulness, patience, mercy and other spiritual qualities.

And we must keep them clean! The Lord told us how our garments get dirty: "Hating even the garment spotted by the flesh" (Jude 23). We dirty our spiritual garments when we give in to our carnal, earthly lusts.

Let's not be children that don't care about their clothes. Let's clothe ourselves as Jesus showed us **and** stay clean. Clean clothes aren't just nice, they're VITAL:

"Thou hast a few names even in Sardis which have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with me in white: for they are worthy. He that overcometh, the same shall be clothed in white raiment; and I will not blot out his name out of the book of life" - Revelation 3:4,5

Let's be mindful of our SPIRITUAL garments, and keep them clean so the Lord won't blot our names out of the Book of Life and that someday we also might walk with our Lord in garments pure and white.
