When Love is Bad

Even though Jesus taught that love is the greatest commandment (Matthew 22:36-40), we are also warned that there are certain types of love that are unprofitable and evil. The following are examples of love that we should not have:

Love of money – "For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil: which some reaching after have been led astray from the faith, and have pierced themselves through with many sorrows" (1 Timothy 6:10 ASV).

Love of the world - "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him" (1 John 2:15).

Love of prestige - "It is not good to eat much honey: so for men to search their own glory is not glory" (Proverbs 25:27); "For whosoever exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted" (Luke 14:11).

Love of idols - "Thou shalt fear the Lord thy God, and serve him, and shalt swear by his name. Ye shall not go after other gods, of the gods of the people which are round about you" (Deuteronomy 6:13, 14).

Excessive love of self – "For men shall be lovers of their own selves..." (2 Timothy 3:2); "And that he died for all, that they which live should not henceforth live unto themselves, but unto him which died for them, and rose again" (2 Corinthians 5:15); "...in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves. Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others" (Philipp. 2:3, 4).

Love of strife – "As coals are to burning coals, and wood to fire; so is a contentious man to kindle strife" (Proverbs 26:21); "But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth. This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is earthly, sensual, devilish. For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work" (James 3:14-16).

Love of sin - "That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness" (2 Thessalonians 2:12); "Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them" (Romans 1:32).

"ELDERS ... FEED THE FLOCK OF GOD" - 1 Peter 5:1,2

This past Sunday we kicked off our **Work Team** program. We want the Work Teams to organize members of the church and build them up in the fellowship of doing the work of the church in **evangelism**, **visitation** and **edification**.

All members have been assigned to one of four **Work Teams**. Participation by members is **voluntary**, but if you commit to the work we expect you to follow through. To be successful, we need each member to do the best they can. Each team has a **Team Captain**:

Team **A** - Gerald Boyd Team **B** - Billy Geiger Team **C** - Ken Parks Team **D** - Jones Gamble

Each Sunday one team is designated the Assignment Team for the upcoming

week. The Team Captain for that week's Assignment Team is given Assignment Cards by the Work Team Coordinator, Jerry Manning. Typical assignments would be to visit a shut-in, make a phone call, write a card, or take someone some food.

The Assignment Team then meets as soon as it can (that Sunday afternoon, or

The Assignment Team then meets as soon as it can (that Sunday afternoon, or Monday evening) at one of its member's homes. The Team Captain is responsible for organizing the meeting. At the meeting, the members talk and share past experiences and some food. One of the members gives a brief devotional then the Team Captain discusses the assignments and passes out the assignment cards to the members, noting who gets which assignment. The members of the team then decide where and when they'll meet 4 weeks later when their team is once again the Assignment Team.

Team Members then perform their assignments that week. They make notes as appropriate on the cards then drop them in the Box at the church building and note the completion of their assignment on the **Work Team Bulletin Board**. The Team Captain checks to make sure all assignment have been completed.

During the week, the Coordinator might become aware of visits that need to be made, for example someone is in the hospital. He'll contact the Assignment Team Captain with the new assignment. The Team Captain in turn will contact one of the Team Members to perform the assignment. Team members should let their Captain know when they're available to make extra visits during the week

The next Sunday, the next team becomes the Assignment Team. Thus each team will be the Assignment Team and meet in someone's home once every 4 weeks. Several times a year, the Teams will be shuffled.
