PRAYER

Hopefully, you pray often. We want the Lord to be pleased with our prayers and to answer them. Have you ever stopped to consider what you pray for, and for whose benefit? You should. For a good example, look at Solomon's prayer: what he *didn't* ask for, how pleased the Lord was, and the result:

"And hast not asked for THYSELF long life; neither has asked riches for thyself, nor hast asked the life of thine enemies; but hast asked for thyself UNDERSTANDING to discern judgement; behold, I have done according to thy words:" - 1 Kings 3:11,12

How many of these things will be with us 100 years from now? None! How important are they really then?

Remember also to pray for things that are **spiritual**. Things that we can keep forever. Things we need like: love, mercy, humility, understanding, meekness, patience, honesty. These are qualities of the heart. They are spiritual and will be with us eternally! These are the things that matter to God and that will truly help us reach heaven. Heaven and our soul is what matters in the long run—not our success in this world.

Remember too, Solomon didn't really ask for himself. He wanted to help others. Jesus likewise, as well as Paul. Look at their prayers, who they were for and for what. Remember, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" - Acts 20:35. If we pray for the benefit of others don't you think God, who gave his Son for us, is more likely to be pleased.

We all want to get to heaven. This should be our #1 goal. Let's make sure we're aiming at the right target — and asking for the **best** things to help us, and everyone else, get there!
