## **BE CHRISTIANS**

"And the disciples were called Christians first in Antioch."—Acts 11:26

The disciples were called **Christians** by God. It was a <u>divine</u> proclamation, a name given by God, not by man. Read Acts 11 and you'll see **why** God called them Christians—they were **acting** like it.

If we claim to be Christians, then we also need to *act* like it. We need to act like those good disciples described in the <u>Acts of the Apostles</u> and other books of the New Testament, because our hearts should be the same. The Lord told us as much:

"If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above" - Colossians 3:1

This is really part and parcel of our repentance—changing our minds. Not minding the earthly, physical things, but instead setting our desires, our fulfillment on the heavenly, spiritual, eternal things God has called us to:

"Forasmuch then as Christ hath suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves likewise with the same mind: for he that hath suffered in the flesh hath ceased from sin; That he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God. ... Wherein they think it strange that ye run not with them to the same excess of riot, speaking evil of you: " - 1 Peter 4:1-4

They might think us strange and speak ill of us, but God will call us Christians.

# **BE CONTENT - MOVE ON**

A poor man was out looking for food for himself and his family. It was cold, and he wore an old, cast off, badly torn and stained overcoat. It looked bad, but kept him fairly warm. A passer by asked him if he wouldn't like a better coat? He replied, "No, it's ok" and moved on. There were a lot of things he'd *like* to have, but he was looking for those things he *needed*. His coat was sufficient and he knew it. What he needed was to find food for himself and his family, not to stop and worry about a coat. If he hadn't been satisfied with the coat and instead gone looking for something better, he would have been distracted from looking for the more important things. He and his family would then likely go hungry. No, he had his goal and priorities right.

What's your goal? This world, or the next? Are cares for things of **this** world distracting you from what you <u>need</u> to be doing in the church—preparing for the **next** world? That's <u>not</u> what God wants:

### "Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee." - Hebrews 13:5

God wants us to be content with the physical things we have <u>so</u> we'll devote ourselves instead to the <u>spiritual</u> things and grow in Godliness.

#### "But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content." - 1 Timothy 6:6-8

The Lord hasn't given us "Hand-me-downs". What could we want that would be better than what he's given us — His **Son**, a hope of *resurrection* to eternal life with Him, and **three promises** to get us there, if we'll have faith and **act** on them:

"ASK, and it shall be given you; SEEK, and ye shall find; KNOCK, and it shall be opened unto you:" - Matthew 7:7

Let us be content with what we have, and look forward to what we need!

"but *this* one thing *I do*, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." - Philippians 3:13

If we're tempted or want to look back to the things of the world  $\ldots$ 

"Remember Lot's wife." - Luke 17:32
