The New Testament — Our Guide

When the church was established and began to work, Paul wrote 14 letters to churches and preachers telling them how to live. James wrote one letter, Peter two, John three, and Jude one. These are all letters of church discipline and government, telling church members how to live.

The last book in the New Testament was written by John. The Revelation not only tells of the past and the present in the first century, but crosses the river of death and tells us of the future home God has prepared for those who love Him and do His commandments. He tells us that on the other side of the river of death there is no night, but one eternal day; no sickness, sorrow, pain, or death. The river of life and the tree of life are found there. So the New Testament — properly divided, read, understood, and obeyed — is a safe guide to lead us into the city whose Builder and Maker is God.

In summary, there are 27 books in the New Testament. Matthew, Mark, Luke and John tell me what I must believe in order to be saved. Acts of Apostles tells me what I must do to be saved. The 21 letters of Christian instruction that follow tell me how I must live and work after I am saved in order to finally reach the heavenly home we read about in the last book of the Bible.

My brethren are often condemned for preaching so much in Acts of Apostles, but this will be our leading book as long as we teach salvation to a dying world, for this is where we find the plan of salvation first taught by the apostles after they had Holy Ghost baptism which qualified them to preach the gospel to all the world. As long as we teach the same things the apostles taught them to do, we are sure we are teaching the word of God, and we are also sure we will be rewarded at the last day for so doing. So, let all be satisfied with the simple word of God, to teach and fight it out along that line, knowing that if we do this, heaven will be our home.

When Ye Pray

We are praying the wrong kind of prayers when we endeavour to reverse the proper relationship between God and man. Properly speaking, God is the Creator, man is the creature. If this is true, as we glibly assert, then our prayers should respect and exemplify that relationship.

But how often are we found praying as if God lives to provide us with what we want; so that, instead of seeking divine guidance, our obvious efforts are to obtain divine reinforcements. Prayers which are "thing-centered" or "self-centered," rather than "God-centered" are wrong kinds of prayers.

"GIVE BACK A PORTION . . . "

"Give back a portion of the things you've so richly blessed us with..." is a phrase you'll often hear in a prayer before an offering is collected. It's good for us to be reminded, and remember, **where** what we have comes from.

But we should also remember *what* the Lord had given us, so we'll be sure return a portion of *everything* He's given us and not leave anything out. Yes, He provides us with food, clothing and shelter, but these are nothing when compared to the *other* things He gives us. Things like: righteous **JUDGEMENT**, **MERCY** when we're helpless, **FAITHFULNESS** in His promises, **FORGIVENESS** of sins against Him, **GRACE** to be like Him, **PEACE** with Him, **HOPE** for an eternity with Him.

Say each one of these **aloud**. Thank God for them. **Each** one is an incomparable **gift** from Him. But **guess what**?, God wants us to **give** a portion of **these** back to Him also! The Lord rebuked the Pharisees for not doing this and we certainly don't want to be like them:

"Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For ye pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, JUDGE-MENT, MERCY and FAITH: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone." - Matthew 23:23

And how might we give these things back to the Lord? He said, like this:

"Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me." - Matthew 25:40

Have you given anyone **FORGIVENESS**? Have you given anyone **MERCY**? Have you been **FAITHFUL** to others? Have you shown anyone **GRACE**? Have you given anyone **HOPE** of eternal life? Remember:

"Freely have you received, freely give." - Matthew 10:8

It's good that we give of the *physical* things the Lord has given us. We ought to. But let's not leave the *other* things undone, for they are *eternal!* (2 Cor 4:18)

Faith Alone Is Not Belief In God

"He that obeyeth not the Son shall not see life" (John 3:36 ASV). This truth is seen when "Jehovah said unto Moses and Aaron, Because ye believed not in me, to sanctify me in the eyes of the children of Israel" (Num. 20:12 ASV). They had not the "conviction" to do just what God said do. God said unto them, "...speak ye unto the rock before their eyes" (Num. 20:8 ASV). But they "smote the rock" (Num. 20:11). Hence God says, "Ye believed not in me" (Num. 20:12 ASV).

What is it to "believe in" God? It is to do trustingly and lovingly just what He says. This "faith alone" system is the popular doctrine in pulpits and on rostrums of the modern pastor and moneyloving evangelist. There is nothing that they put over with a show that is more deceiving and soulblighting.
