### CALLING ON THE NAME OF THE LORD

What does it mean to "call on the name of the Lord?" Legion are they who teach that this means to approach Christ in prayer, asking him to forgive one's own sins and come into one's heart for the purpose of being his or her "personal Savior." Usually, **Romans 10:13** is quoted as a proof text for this teaching: "For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved." However, this phrase is used in other places in the Bible and to understand its meaning in Romans, the phrase should be studied in the other contexts as well.

In Romans 10, Paul is quoting Joel 2:32 emphasizing the universal nature of the Gospel. Another New Testament spokesman who quoted Joel was Peter on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:21). Peter was preaching to those who were guilty of shedding the innocent blood of Jesus. Upon realizing the severity of their crime, the convicted crowd cried out, "Men and brethren, what shall we do?" They knew they were guilty and they knew they needed forgiveness. In addition, they had heard Peter quote Joel, saying, **"Whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved."** So, what was Peter's response to their question? Did he tell them to pray to Jesus for forgiveness? Did he command them to ask Christ to come into their hearts as their personal Savior? No! He told them to **"Repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38).** Here is inspired commentary on the phrase, "call on the name of the Lord." According to Peter, who was speaking by inspiration, calling on the name of the Lord is obeying the gospel.

What about you? Are you one who calls on the name of the Lord (I Cor. 1:2)? That is, are you one who obeys the Christ? If not, why not determine to follow the example of those 3,000 on the day of Pentecost, and call on his name today and continue to do so all the days of your life.

## PLAN B?

A while back, I wrote about a message displayed on the sign of a local interdenominational church. That message proclaimed that baptism is a non-essential in God's plan to save mankind. The thrust of the article was to prove how that particular proclamation contradicts the Bible. Well, they're at it again. This time, however, instead of contradicting the Scriptures with their sign, they've contradicted themselves!

The latest message that grabbed my attention was something to this effect: Jesus does not have a plan B. While all who are familiar with the Bible know the truthfulness of this point, the group who proclaimed it on their sign is a part of a movement that teaches not only does God have a plan B, but He also has a plan C, plan D, and plan E (to name just a few). Denominationalism, of which this local church is an obvious part, glories in the false notion that we're all going to heaven; we're just taking different routes. If this idea doesn't promote a multiplicity of plans, then I don't know what does.

The fact is, the New Testament condemns the denominational philosophy. Jesus prayed that His followers be united (Jn. 17:20-21). Such unity necessitates mutual adherence to the Scriptures. Inspiration requires that all who follow the Savior speak the same thing, have no divisions, and be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment (1 Cor. 1:10). It's one thing to proclaim that God doesn't have a plan B. But it's quite another to actually give up denominational error in order to demonstrate it.

Someone has written, "There is no more insidious danger than the lure of the good enough." This is particularly true in the realm of the spiritual. Self-satisfaction is the mother of complacency. Complacency is the mother of sloth. And sloth brings condemnation. Well did Paul warn Christians, "For if anyone thinks himself to be something when he is nothing, he deceives himself" (Galatians 6:3). One who thinks he knows enough will cease to study. One who thinks he gives enough will not increase his giving. One who thinks he does enough will cease from doing. The feeling that we are "good enough" is the grave of growth. Growth is the law of life. Like Paul of old, we should rather say, "I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:13-14). Like an old Scots preacher, we should pray: "Lord, keep me alive as long as I live." Let us not be seduced by "the lure of the good enough."
