SACRIFICE

Sacrifice comes from a Greek word that means "to kill". When we kill something, it's dead and gone; we don't have it anymore—we give it up, we sacrifice it. Consider this list of those who've sacrificed something.

ABRAHAM Genesis 12:1.4 gave up country and kindred **MOSES** gave up a rich life in Egypt Hebrews 11:26 **JEPTHA** gave up his only daughter **Judges 11:35** The WIDOW gave up all her living Mark 12:44 **PAUL** Philippians 3:8 gave up all things **TIMOTHY** gave up caring for himself Philippians 2:20 GOD gave his Son John 3:16 **JESUS** Matthew 20:28 gave his Life

They all sacrificed—and for someone else, not themselves. It cost them greatly! Not unreasonably then, Jesus told us he *requires* the same from us: "And he said to them ALL, If ANY man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me." (Luke 9:23).

Jesus took up his cross to die. So do we. But not in a physical sense, as we're told: "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a LIVING sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." (Romans 12:1) God wants a *living* sacrifice, one that keeps on giving. As Jesus said, we need to take up our cross "daily".

We might think of things that are "sacrifices" for us. But they can't substitute for what God has told us He wants us to kill: "Therefore put to death your members which are on the earth; fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness ... But now you also put off all these; anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication out of your mouth. Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds;" (Colossians 3:5-9) All those things we do to please ourselves; the Lord has said—lose them, so we might gain Christ.

"But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ." - Philippians 3:7 Don't be sad, instead rejoice and take comfort in the thought that those things we lose, are gain to Christ, and He and His Father will then be glad to welcome us - Ed Kelleher, West Columbia church of Christ, South Carolina home.

Sun AM Sermon—MORAL THINKING

What is your baseline for determining what is moral and immoral; is it the Bible or other factors?

Main Text - 1 Peter 4:1-4

- 1. Arm yourselves with the same way of thinking.
- 2. Live for the will of God.
- 3. The Christian's "spiritual barometer" is different from all others.

DEATH OFFERS HOPE

To some that statement is a shock. Most people feel there is no hope in death, but notice what the apostle Paul said in First Thessalonians 4:13, "But I would not have you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning them which are asleep, that ye sorrow not, even as others which have no hope." Unlike the world which has no hope, the Christian has a lively hope — a hope built upon the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead: "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" - 1 Peter 1:3

In First Corinthians 15:55-57, the apostle Paul again enlightens us as to death. In this passage, Paul teaches us that there is victory over death of which the faithful will be a part. He said, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

It is through death that we gain the victory! Heaven is not ours until we pass from life unto death. We cannot be with the Lord until we are raised, and we cannot be raised until we die. Therefore, death offers hope because through death we gain life eternal. It is with these thoughts Paul said, "Wherefore comfort one another with these words." (1 Thess. 4:18).

Death sometimes catches us off guard and shocks us back to reality as to what is really important. We can all be thankful that certain incidents happen in life that help us to keep a proper perspective on life and on death. These incidents help us deal with the cold reality of death. Yes, they come as a shock, but with God's help and instruction, we are able to deal with them trusting in Him to carry us through.

DEATH MUST BE PREPARED FOR

Life is actually a preparation for death. Jesus said, "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal" (Matt. 6:19-20).
