WHY THINK ABOUT BAPTISM?

Again, most people in religion, especially preachers of religion (and some think they are preaching the gospel of Jesus) will tell you very quickly that baptism does not matter when considering forgiveness of sins, or eternal welfare. This preaching even shows up occasionally in the church of our Lord indirectly.

From the attitudes and words we see and hear one would think that the preachers of error would think that some bunch of humans thought up an action called baptism, and began to teach it to the world.

In truth God began baptism through John, the baptizer. It was not the idea of any human. John's immersion was not the same as that Jesus commanded in the great commission (Matt 28:19, Mark 16:15-16). Consequently after Jesus commanded baptism, John's immersion was not to be practiced.

So we would think about baptism because of where it came from — because of its origin, or who originated it. God.

We should think about baptism because of who commanded the one baptism that now stands between men and forgiveness. Jesus.

We should think about baptism because of what it is. It IS a burial in water - Romans 6:3 -4 and Acts 10:47-48

We should think about baptism because of what it does, or accomplishes. This is revealed to us in many passages, notably Acts 2:38; Mark I6:I5-16; Acts 22:16; 1 Peter 3:20-

We should think about baptism because of what must precede it before it can be of value to us. Acts 8:37 tells this.

We should think about baptism because of where we are, or a person is, without it, and before it. 1 Corinthians 12:13 and Galatians 3:26-27 tell us this.

We should think about baptism because of the wrong practices involving the subject the sprinkling of water on a person and calling that "one of the modes of baptism." The same is to be considered in the pouring of water, ceremoniously, on a person. God said that it is burial in Romans. 6:3-4 and Colossians 2:14. God DOES NOT mention modes — this is entirely a man made subject. It was introduced into religion centuries after the gospel was completed.

Likewise the idea that baptism has no bearing on forgiveness or man's eternal welfare. This, too, is a man-made idea and teaching. When you hear either, ask the one presenting them to refer you to the book, chapter & verse in God's word. Behold, he can't

CHURCH LEADERSHIP — IS YOU!

God's word is replete with the work, power and necessity of <u>examples</u>:

- Elders are to lead the flock—by example. 1 Peter 5:4
- Woman convert their non-Christian husbands—by example. 1 Peter 3:1
- **Jesus** left us an example to follow. 1 Peter 2:21
- **Disciples** are followers, looking to be like their master. Luke 6:40
- Sons do what they see their father's do. John 5:19

The Lord condemned the Pharisees for <u>not</u> leading by example: "but do <u>not</u> ye after their works: for they say, and do not" - Matthew 23:3 Read the whole chapter.

Paul commanded Timothy to be an example; not in dress, or grooming, or table manners, but in things that <u>each and every Christian must possess</u>: "... be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity." - 1 Timothy 4:12 These are things we <u>must</u> do for ourselves—<u>and</u> for others!

I got the below list at a local preacher elder meeting (a meeting where men influence others by their example, thanks Mickey!). Ask yourself these questions and see if you are happy with the answers (see scripture below):

What if everyone in the church:

- Loved as I love?
- Prayed as I pray?
- Sang as I sang?
- Studied the Bible as I study?
- Attended as I attend?
- Paid attention to preaching and teaching as I do?
- Gave to the Lord's work as I gave?
- Ministered as I do?
- Lived as I live?

Would you want to be there? Would it be a church pleasing to God? Do you then see <u>your</u> role in <u>leading</u> the church by doing what the Lord commanded? Are you fulfilling it? If not, why not?

Jesus led by example. What can be more compelling, more forceful in producing obedience to the Lord's command to minister to others than the <u>example</u> of our Lord and Master washing the disciple's feet. He said as much:

"For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you. ... If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them." - John 13:15

Be happy! Be a good example, and a leader in the Lord's church! And remember, the Lord will be the judge, not your "friends" on Facebook.
