No More Sins & Thanks for the Bacon

In the thirtieth verse of the first chapter of Genesis it can be read that God gave "every green plant for food" to man. If I had never read this in the Bible I'd be rather skeptical. Most vegetables taste like cardboard topped with the residue from packaging tape.

Now a food which taste fantastic, even if a little undercooked or slightly burnt is bacon. Animals are very instinctive for their survival. Like humans, animals must eat to live. When I have bacon the dog comes running into the kitchen. When I have vegetables the dog comes running into the kitchen but this only happens because he mistakenly confuses the noise made from handling the vegetable bag with that of the bacon package. Upon learning there is no bacon his interest in the food is instantly diminished.

I've often wondered how I would have fared living under the Law of Moses as pig was an unclean food. Perhaps that would have never been an issue, they did not eat pig, so they did not cook pig to see what they were missing. I more so wonder what my reaction would be if I were a Jew living during the days of Jesus when He declared all foods clean (Mark 7:19) and I was able to taste bacon for the first time. Really, it's rather unimportant even though I'm very curious.

Something of immeasurably greater significance and value would be knowing the blessings of Jesus and the covenant He instituted. The results is my sins would be remembered no more (Jer. 31:34; Heb. 8:12). This statement is often misunderstood. God is still fully aware of all our failures and foolish acts. To remember them no more means the constant reminders of sin seen through sacrificial offerings and the annual Day of Atonement were no longer necessary, nor would they be accepted by God (Heb. 10:1-18).

God "forgets" the sin of those who are obedient to Christ. Obedience to Christ, in very simple terms, means to make Him your Lord. Just as Paul wrote in the well known passage in Galatians 2:20 "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me." We live because of Christ, and He is to live in us. Enjoy your bacon, but enjoy forgiveness more.

IS GOD'S LOVE ENOUGH?

Solomon was a man that God loved. Did you know that Solomon even had another name; one specially given by God? It was *Jedidiah*, which means "Beloved of the Lord" (2 Samuel 12:24-25). But was that enough to keep Solomon secure? Was he free from care about his relationship with God? "After all, God LOVES me!"

No, it wasn't enough. We know that Solomon fell away from God, that God's love **wasn't** enough. Solomon needed to love God also. It was the love of <u>other</u> things which turned Solomon away from God. A wiser man there never was, nor a richer. Yet it wasn't enough.

"For it came to pass, when Solomon was old, that his wives turned away his heart after other gods: and his heart was not perfect with the Lord his God" - 1 Kings 11:4

The Jews were the same way. God loved them, they were <u>His</u> people. The Lord sent prophets to them, time and again, to warn them and bring them back. He sent JESUS to them. But it wasn't enough. <u>They</u> didn't love God in return. Listen to Jesus' lament, and the condemnation at the end:

"O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together; even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and YE WOULD NOT!" -Matthew 23:37

God wanted them, but <u>they</u> didn't want God, not really—at least not on God's terms. They lost. So can we. Are we wiser than Solomon? Satan and his servants are constantly working to fool us with lies and misdirections. Remember Eve vs Satan in the garden? God told us how to know we love him:

"If ye love me, keep my commandments. ... If a man love me, he will keep my words: ... He that loveth me not keepeth not my sayings:" - John 14:15,23,24

God's love <u>is</u> enough, <u>if</u> we'll love Him. True love will show itself by obedience to His commands. What we feel isn't love if it doesn't compel us to obey. So, first and foremost, let's get our HEARTS right, loving God, <u>wanting</u> to please him, truly realizing His great love and desire for us to be with Him. The actions will follow. Like Jesus said:

"... cleanse first that *which is* within the cup and platter, that the outside of them may be clean also." - Matthew 23:26
