### You can lead a horse to truth but you can't make him believe it.

Truth is a word which does not have much of a definition anymore. It has been made to have a very flexible meaning. Just like the old Burger King slogan "Your way right away," that is probably how most Americans now understand truth.

This redefinition of truth has all but destroyed the ability to reason through facts and reality by many. Instead of taking facts and processing them one will simply deny their existence if they do not care for the logical conclusion. I was reminded of this the other night while listening to talk radio. The producer of the show denied the reality of the basis for the movie "Rudy." The host and producer argued back and forth over both the quality of the movie and the reality of its basis.

The producer hated the movie, which he is allowed to do. I've never known of a football fan who hated "Rudy" (this was sports-talk radio) but this guy did. His distaste for the movie carried him so far as to deny the actual story of Rudy Ruettiger. He claimed not to believe the events and story portrayed in the movie really happened. As with all real events and stories creative licenses are taken when producing a movie about them, so he cited some of those licenses in his case. This however does not disprove the true story of Mr. Reuttiger. There are photos, there is video evidence available of the real Ruettiger, and there are eyewitnesses to the story of Rudy.

As the old saying goes, "You can lead a horse to water but you can't make him drink," so it is with truth. Even though the very definition of truth is being redefined that doesn't mean truth, truly is non-existent. As a Christian you can never back down from or compromise truth. We have to put the truth of God before people, and they must decided what to do with it. Provide truth as often as possible and as patiently and compassionately as you can. Everyone deserves a chance to hear the message of the gospel. That much the church is responsible for. What to do with it is up to those we deliver it to and that is out of our hands. But in obeying the truth of God, we must find the horses and get them to the water.

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#### ARE BIBLE CLASSES A WASTER OF TIME?

In the minds of some people, Bible classes are not important. They may even consider them just "a waste of time." What should our attitude be toward them?

Why do we have Bible classes on Sunday and Wednesday? Do we have classes just because others have them? Do we have classes just so we can say that we are at least doing something? Until we come to learn the significance of them, we will not appreciate them as we should. If we appreciate them, then and only then will attitudes and attendance change for the better.

Bible classes are significant because they help promote the work of the church. The Bible classes are one avenue through which the Word of God can be taught. We certainly want to take advantage of every opportunity to teach and study from the Bible (2 Tim. 2:15; Psa. 1:1-3).
